REFLECTION

On this the Second Sunday of Advent, we are invited to reflect upon the role of John the Baptist, who prepared the way for Jesus and the salvation that he would bring to us. His description of John the Baptist is as an ascetic, living in the desert, clothed in camel hair, and eating locusts (a flower) and wild honey. The people of Judea and Jerusalem flock to him, listening to his message of repentance and forgiveness; they also come to him to be baptised. St Mark's Gospel is clear, however, that John the Baptist's role is only to prepare the way for another who will come, one who is greater than John. We hear John the Baptist contrast his baptism of repentance with the baptism that Jesus will inaugurate. John says that he has baptised with water, but that the one who is to come will baptise with the Holy Spirit.

John's baptism was not yet a Christian baptism, but a preparation for the Sacrament of Baptism through which sins are forgiven and the gift of the Holy Spirit is received - a new beginning! John the Baptist is presented to us as a model during Advent as we, too, are called upon to prepare a way for the Lord. This pandemic has made life difficult for us all, but today let us remember especially all those facing valleys and mountains in their lives that make it harder for them to celebrate Advent - those struggling to rebuild their lives - the migrants and refugees at our borders, the victims of violence in our cities, the bereaved, the lost the broken. What are the valleys and mountains in our lives? We all know there is no going back to how it was before and though it is often very difficult, we have to realise and accept that the Coming One doesn't eliminate all the suffering and sorrow along life's path - but he does fill us with joy, justice, forgiveness, and mercy through which we can all move towards healing, restoration, and the chance for a new beginning. Like John the Baptist, we are messengers in service to one who is greater than we are. Our Baptism commissions us to call others to a new life as disciples of Jesus. As one more candle of the Advent Wreath is lit, let us pray that this Advent season will remind us of how we are all called to make changes in our lives, to make straight the path of the Lord.
